## SENTENCING MINUTES

On this date the above-named defendant appeared in person and with counsel for sentencing.

- Defendant ordered to comply with the following special conditions of probation.

1. The defendant shall submit to a search of his person, real and/or personal property, residence, place of business or employment, and/or vehicle(s) conducted by the U.S. Probation Office based upon reasonable suspicion of criminal activity or a violation of any condition of supervision.

2. The defendant shall spend the first six months of his term of probation under the terms and conditions of home detention, without location monitoring. During home detention, the defendant shall not leave his residence for any reason without authorization form the U.S. Probation Officer. When authorized, the defendant is allowed to leave his residence for employment, medical appointments, religious purposes, or such other times as may be specifically authorized by the U.S. Probation Officer.

(XI) The lump sum payment of \$25,100 is due immediately. If not paid immediately, any unpaid financial penalty shall become a condition of probation and shall be paid in monthly installments of \$315 or 15% of the defendant's gross monthly household income, whichever is greater, with the entire balance to be paid in full no later than one month prior to the end of the probation period.

- (X) Defendant ordered to pay total special assessment of \$100.00 for Count 1, which is due immediately.
- (X) Defendant advised of right to appeal sentence imposed.
- (X) Defendant released on probation under the supervision of the U.S. Probation Office.
